C. [Menstrual Product Drive @ Lafun Elevator Lobby](#)

1. Sarah Galbenski: Between the Gender Relations department and FemenistND. It was in Duncan, but is now in LaFun. D. Student Advisory Group for Campus Reopening

1. Sarah Galbenski: Testing compliance continues to be more and more amazing, with more than 99% of tests being shown up for. This is really awesome because it is such an instrumental part in ensuring our campus community remains safe.
2. Supplemental testing continues to have more issues. I just want to clarify that when you get a supplemental test it is not because they suspect something is wrong. Perhaps there is a clump in your class or your dorm, so it is just to take additional precautions and survey potential trends.
3. Last week's communication about not being able to meet in person I know was a bit of a shock if we can go back to how we felt then, but we know that it was a necessary measure to take. It is exciting that outdoor activities could open even before March 1, and then classroom spaces being opened up next hopefully. As cases go down, we hope to loosen restrictions more and more. Hopefully we will be together in person again soon.

4. One thing students are often unclear about is whether contact tracing is confidential or not. Anything that you say in that contact tracing process is completely confidential; nothing you say will be used to incriminate you or sent to OCS. I would just continue to urge you that if you get one of those contact tracing calls to be honest. It helps the University in their data and it will not hurt you in any way.
5. Two more updates down the line, we are still very hopeful that the state of Indiana will allow Notre Dame to be a distribution site. The county just went to 60 plus, which is great for some Notre Dame faculty, and the numbers of vaccinations here have most definitely increased.
6. Graduation will probably just be one mass gathering, with many modifications. The University has committed to providing a safe, in person gathering, so we are just having to get a little creative. Graduation is of course very much on the minds of the Seniors, so just keep that in mind.

[University-Sponsored Bus Service to Chicago Airports](#) - read by Izzy Edgar

1. Izzy Edgar: Essentially asking the university to expand this ride service, given how busy it typically is in non-COVID years. We will also be sending out a survey to the Student body about the former Coach USA program and the new Royal Excursion program to get student feedback.

b) Izzy Edgar: Yeah so again I am not sure specifically about the cost structure. To be honest, I think cost is why the initial contract ended. Coach USA was running all the time. Any given day of the week buses would come from the airport, with times just being increased around the breaks. I know Royal Excursion prices are approximately five dollars more, but they have said if more students want to ride the buses they will provide more buses. The point of this resolution is to

show the University that there is a student interest in having more buses be available for transportation to and from the Chicago airports to alleviate pressure of paying for an Uber or South Bend flights.
