 - Christian Quilon: I ask unanimous consent that the reading of the letter be dispensed with.
 - Maclane Farrel: I can guarantee that Andreas will do a really good job in this role and be committed. I strongly suggest voting in favor of his nomination.
 - 3. Madeline Smith: I worked with Andreas last year on the Marketing Committee. He did a really good job of managing sales in FYCC.

- C. Discussion on Proposed Student Activities Break Days
 - Matthew Bisner: We want to engage interest in break days with no programming or club meetings. I hope we could weigh those options and convey that to our advisor.
 - 2. Benjamin Erhardt: This is just a break day from student activities, not exactly like what we had?
 - 3. Matthew Bisner: It would be just a programming break day, I don't think we would get classes off.
 - Maclane Farrel: If we don't get classes off, I am not sure what it would accomplish. The majority of our days are spent in class or doing work for class.
 - 5. Allan Njomo: The nature of the idea is that students put a lot of time into programming, and the meaning of this is that students could catch up on work or take care of their mental health and rest.
 - 6. Mary Devoe: I think the programming that would be planned for clubs that day would just move days. I don't know if it would give students a break.
 - Maclane Farrel: A lot of students actually like the programming and clubs they do.
 - 8. Abraham Figueroa: If you're not an executive officer, and just a member of the club, you could also just not go to programming that day.
 - 9. Matthew Bisner: Is there something that would be helpful for relieving stress?
 - 10. Colin Murray: A day of no classes.

- 11. Annika Barron: I remember a point in the semester last year when they recommended teachers lay off their assignments for a week or even just one day. I know that is tricky for teachers, but it was really helpful.
- 12. Jacob Lowry: I feel like that's not something you can mandate. I had a lot of professors that didn't change anything at all.
- 13. Maddie Means: Would the break in programming apply to varsity athletics?
- 14. Allan Njomo: It would only be clubs.
- 15. Maclane Farrel: I do think that anything helps. I have a lot of professors who sometimes show why they're teaching what they're teaching and why it's relevant. Maybe they could advise all professors to take a day and do that type of class.
- 16. Caroline Cameron: Maybe advising faculty to do something next semester of the sort we're talking about would be helpful. McWell is trying to teach students what it means to actually take a break from schoolwork efficiently. Maybe doing something with McWell would serve students.
- 17. Madeline Smith: Maybe reminding faculty to prioritize mental health instead of revising the workload could help.
- 18. Danny Schermerhorn: When we had restoration week last year, I could see that teachers were annoyed by it. Did it really help that much? I feel that education and other things might be a better way to go than not having class or clubs.

- 19. Benjamin Erhardt: Molly Walsh in CLC talked about how professors are cognizant of student needs. Going from the top down is not easy. I think it's important to keep a feel on how students are feeling this year and apply things next semester. It's hard with peer pressure in this communal environment to take a break. Maybe having McWell come to every dorm and giving presentations would be helpful. Canceling activities for a day probably won't solve the root issue. There's gotta be improvements in execution.
- 20. Jacob Lowry: Maybe every professor takes 5 or 10 minutes to give a reminder that mental health matters and to remind students that they have options and can talk to their professors.
- 21. Alix Basden: Our Directors of Health and Wellbeing Austen and Julia are working on standardizing that mental health message from professors.
