I. OPENING BUSINESS

- A. Call to Order
Student Union Board Manager Paul Krivickas called the meeting to order at 6:03.
- B. Invocation
Paul Krivickas led the invocation.
- C. Roll Call
Neal Driscoll and Anhtuan Do were absent.
- D. Approval of the September 10, 2001 Executive Summary
Under New Business, BOG should replace BOF. The September 10, 2001 Executive Summary was approved unanimously after a motion from Paul Krivickas.

II. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- A. Student Senate Update
 - Many Senate meetings were canceled due to events of Tuesday, September 11.
 - Senate discussed presenting the agenda in the Observer the day of meetings.
 - Some committee meetings will be in the dining halls to induce student interaction. The topic for discussion of the committee meetings will be advertised in the dining hall.
 - Student Senate is constructing a bulletin board to place in the student government office to keep everyone abreast of committee objectives.
 - The Senate is trying to clarify the changes in the Dean's list requirements by talking with Provost Hatch, Fr. Poorman, and the Academic Council advisor.
- B. St. Mary's College Update
 - The Board of Governance will hand out whistles on Thursday to St. Mary's student Body.
 - "Light the Night," a walk to benefit the quest for a cure to Leukemia, will be Wednesday at 7PM in Howard Park.
- C. Student Activities Office Update

 - To advertise on inserts the cost is \$55 per 1000 inserts, and to advertise to the whole student body, the estimated cost would be \$700. Sponsorships are still an option to defray costs.

- John Hagan suggested that the Exec Cab ask CARE to cosponsor the safety announcement. Erin said the ad, though, was supposed to symbolize the unity of the SMC and ND campus.
- Brooke suggested that the Office of the President could cosponsor the ad if Tuesday night's On/Off-Campus Safety Forum was advertised at the same time.

- Discussion arose as to whether we should encourage students to wear red, white, and blue or still encourage the purchase of The Shirt.


V. ANNOUNCEMENTS
