**I. OPENING BUSINESS**

D. Approval of the January 23, 2002 Minutes

**II. PODIUM**

A. Progressive Student Alliance, Martha Panzer

B. OutreachND, Brad Manzer and Molly Morin

- ♣ Brad and Molly approached the Senate to spread awareness of the resources available for gay and lesbian students on campus.
- ♣ The Standing Committee on Gay and Lesbian Student Needs suggests policies to Father Poorman. Only six students are allowed to serve on the committee. ([www.nd.edu/~SCGLSN](http://www.nd.edu/~SCGLSN))
- ♣ Campus Ministry provides a weekend retreat, Solidarity Sunday services, and a religious-oriented group led by Father J. Steele.
- ♣ Sensitivity Training workshops in dorms are also offered. Network training is available for RA's, admissions employees, and security.
- ♣ Plus, there is a program offered at the Counseling Center where students can meet one on one with a professional.
- ♣ OutreachND is not a recognized club, yet it is a resource used by the university, by Campus Ministry and by the counseling center.
- ♣ OutreachND emerged from the group GLSMT. The group meets weekly and has an active member count of 40 and a mailing list of 150. They spread information through their website, referrals, and word of mouth. ([www.outreachnd.org](http://www.outreachnd.org))
- ♣ The group has applied for club recognition, but it was denied. The denial cited the reason as being enough resources are available already. OutreachND wants club recognition so it can reserve rooms for meetings, have a budget, and post signs around campus.

**III. OLD BUSINESS**

A. Nomination and Approval of Judicial Board Representatives

- ♣ In accordance with the Undergraduate Constitution, the Judicial Council must have an Executive Committee. Each dorm chooses commissioners to help run elections and the like. From these dorm commissioners, two are appointed and four are elected to serve on the Executive committee. These six are in charge of the details of elections. Tim Jarotkiewicz presented the six candidates (Jake Teske, Rebecca Williams, Jessica Panza, Amy Eischen, Matt Corgan, and Jesse Norman) and an accompanying letter.

- ♣ A motion brought the nominations to the floor. Jim Ryan called for unanimous approval. All six were approved.
  - ♣ Please note that Nikki McCord abstained from voting.

- ♣ Tim reported that, as Executive Liaison, it was his duty to keep the Senate abreast of elections' status.
  - ♣ Tim announced that the elections are off to a good start. Campaigning started last Saturday and will end at midnight Sunday, February 11.
  - ♣ The primary debate will be held at 7:30PM in Hesburgh Library Auditorium on February 6, 2002.
  - ♣ This past week an allegation against the Moscona/Oxley ticket arose. Tim, with John McCarthy, decided that the infraction was minor and could be remedied by Mocona/Oxley retracting an inter-staff email said to contain insulting or defaming remarks.
