EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
March 24, 2002
Notre Dame Room, LaFortune

I. OPENING BUSINESS

- A. Call to Order
Vice President Brian Moscona called the meeting to order at 6:32.
- B. Invocation
Brian Moscona led the invocation.
- C. Roll Call
Matt Smith, Maggie Morrissey, Padraic McDermott, Brian McKenna, Stephen Garcia, Mary Murphy, Erin Casey, J. F. Jorissen, Adam Russ, and Tim O'Malley were absent.
- D. Approval of the March 20, 2002 Minutes
New Business Section C's 4th Shamrock should read: Jennie Flannery suggested that the increase of 2.25% should perhaps go to the contingency fund rather than to the CCC.
The Executive Summary for March 20, 2002 was approved unanimously.

II. OLD BUSINESS

- A. SS0102-24 Resolution Regarding the Changes in the Alcohol Policy for 2002
- ♣ This amendment was presented at the last session of the Senate. Please see last set of minutes for the precise introduction to the amendment.
 - ♣ Pat Hallahan motioned to remove the 5th WHEREAS clause due to the lack of numbers supporting the clause's claim. Lindsay Zika asked if there was a way to discuss the popularity of the dances without precise numbers. Again, Pat cited the lack of absolute numbers to support the claim. Nikki McCord called for unanimous consent for the motion to remove the clause and consent was granted.
 - ♣ Brooke Norton asked if it really is true that 85% of students live on campus. Pat attributed this number to an online Notre Dame source.
 - ♣ Friendly amendments were made to as a comma after "campus" in the second WHEREAS clause and to change "his" to "this" in the second to last WHEREAS clause.
 - ♣ Jennie Flannery motioned to amend "in which less than 80" to "no more than 60." This amendment failed.
 - ♣ Nick Gaeke motioned to amend the resolution to change "in which less than 80" to "in which less than one percent." This amendment passed.
 - ♣ Pat Hallahan motioned to change the amended part back to its original state because, he argued, based on the parameters of the focus groups, 80 is the absolute maximum number of students that could have been involved in the study. The vote to restore the amended section to its original "in which less than 80" passed 9-6-5.
 - ♣ In the same WHEREAS clause, the motion was made to change "were consulted" to "participated". The motion passed to make such a change.
 - ♣ Tai Romero, in reference to the same WHEREAS clause, asked what the motive behind the focus groups was. Blake Haan read the stated objective as cited in the summary of the groups. Greg Celio then moved to strike "without being told the motive behind the focus group". The motion to strike the clause passed.
 - ♣ The clause now reads: *WHEREAS the basis for the decision as outlined on March 18, 2002 focuses on results from "surveys" and "focus groups" in which less than 80 students participated;*
 - ♣ The Senate voted unanimously to pass the resolution as a whole.
- B. SS0102-23 Amendment Concerning an Increase to Club Allocations
- ♣ Amy O'Connor presented the resolution with numbers to back her presentation printed on the back of the resolution. The resolution calls for an increase in the minimum allotment for CCC from 36.75% to 40%. Brian Clemency explained that part of this increase would be set aside for a collaboration fund within CCC. This collaboration fund is separate to the one controlled by Executive Cabinet. Whereas Executive Cabinet requires collaboration with a larger student union group, the CCC's collaboration fund would not.
 - ♣ Tai Romero and Nikki McCord asked why the Senate should increase the allotment to 40% if the 36.75 percent allotment was already a minimum suggestion. Amy answered that the budget is usually distributed the same every year. Precedence has set the CCC allotment at the minimum every year.

- ♣ Nick Gaeke suggested the friendly amendment: in the BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED clause, change "by" to "be". The friendly amendment was accepted.
- ♣ Nikki McCord pointed out that such a change in the constitution may be too much too soon after the student activity fee increase.
- ♣ Brooke Norton noted that having the actual line item change was important.
- ♣ Jesse Flores stated that if Senate raises CCC's budget, something else will lose the difference.
- ♣ Jim Ryan, a member of the FMB, commented that it is quite clear that the organizations that need more money are the CCC and SUB. Pat Hallahan reported that the increase in CCC funding would most likely have to come from a decrease in SUB funding.
- ♣ Jennie Flannery moved to table the motion. The motion passed 18-3-1.


