

Referral of Senate Bills to Committees Resolution

Drafted 4 April 1998

Whereas the Senate often has measures brought before it which have no direct bearing on the Undergraduate Body of the University of Notre Dame.

Whereas the Senate meetings are often protracted due to excessive debate on measures which have no significance to the Undergraduate Body.

Whereas the measures presented before the Senate should be reviewed before being open for debate on the floor.

Therefore be it resolved that all measures that are brought before the Senate be referred to the oversight committee immediately upon presentation. The oversight committee then refers the measure to the committee which is best suited to deal with the issues in the resolution. The resolution may only be referred to one committee. This committee then may deem the measure appropriate for review and debate by the full Senate. In the case of a measure which has no direct correlation to any committee the oversight committee itself deems the bill appropriate. A simple majority vote of the Senate may bring a resolution to the floor of the full body regardless of committee approval.
