A LETTER REQUESTING THE SENSE OF THE FACULTY SENATE REGARDING CLOCKS IN CLASSROOMS

Whereas, Other academic buildings including Coleman-Morse Center, Nieuwland Science Hall, Haggar Hall, Galvin Science Center, Jordan Hall of Science, and Riley Hall of Art and Design have analog clocks in their classrooms; therefore,

The Student Senate respectfully requests, That the Faculty Senate place this discrepancy in clocks in classrooms on its meeting agenda for discussion at its earliest convenience.

The Student Senate respectfully requests, That the Faculty Senate communicate the sense of the faculty regarding this discrepancy in clocks in classrooms either through the Faculty Senate Liaison to the Student Senate or through a letter addressed to the Student Senate at its earliest convenience.
