Constitutional Amendment to Senate Section

3-17-1

Article VI

Section 1.1d

Replace: Article VI, Section 1.1d - "Each Senator shall have one vote"

With:

"The number of votes a Senator possesses is in direct relation to the population he or she represents. The size of the population is to be determined through a census conducted by the Judicial Council which is to take place every four years in the first month of the Fall semester, beginning with Fall 2006. The number of students residing in the dorm at this time will then be rounded to the nearest ten. Then, after rounding, the number of votes will equal the rounded number divided by 10 (for example: 253 students is rounded to 250 and then results in 25 votes). With the size of the off-campus population being significantly disproportionate to any one dorm, the off-campus Senate vote will be restrained by capping his or her vote to being no greater than 10 more than that of the greatest dorm."
