**A RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE
CONSTITUTION OF THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT BODY
CONCERNING THE ELECTIONS PROCESS**

Resolved by the Student Senate of the University of Notre Dame du Lac,

THAT the Constitution of the Undergraduate Student Body, pursuant to Section (I)(4) of the same, is hereby amended as follows:

I. Subsection (XVII)(1)(a) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) Any Notre Dame undergraduate student in good academic standing (as determined by the Office of the Registrar or the First Year of Studies) and good disciplinary standing (as determined by the Office of Residence Life) is eligible for candidacy.

II. Subsection (XVII)(1)(o) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(o) For the purpose of petitions, the original signature of an undergraduate student shall be required to signify approval of the placement of a candidate or ticket on the ballot.

III. In so many places as it may appear in Article XVII of the Constitution of the Undergraduate Student Body, the word "signature" shall be preceded by the word "original."

IV. A new subsection, to be designated Subsection (XVII)(1)(p), shall be inserted where appropriate and shall read as follows:

(p) In the event that an election proceeds to a runoff, all tickets in the runoff may have a nominal increase in their funding equivalent to 20% of the funding initially allocated for the primary election.

V. Subclause (XVII)(2)(i)(1) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(1) Candidates must furnish independent proof of good academic standing from the First Year of Studies or the Office of the Registrar and proof of good disciplinary standing from the Office of Residence Life.

VI. A new subclause, to be designated Subclause (XVII)(2)(i)(4), shall be inserted where appropriate and shall read as follows:

(4) All write-in materials must be submitted to the Judicial Council for review by no later than four (4) calendar days before the date of the primary election.
